

MINUTES

CULTURE AND ARTS COMMISSION SPECIAL MEETING May 15, 2025

1. **CALL TO ORDER:** **Superintendent Wallace** called the meeting of the Culture and Arts Commission to order at 6:32 p.m.
2. **ROLL CALL:** Commissioners Present: Nader Abumuoilish, Pamela Gamble, Nicole Hanhan, Janet Monaghan, and Stephen Seymour. Absences: Vice Chair Jeanne George. Staff Present: Karlen, Wallace, and Ibarra.
3. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** **Superintendent Wallace** led the Pledge of Allegiance.
4. **REVIEW OF AGENDA:** No changes.
5. **ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES:** Minutes from January 16, 2025. **MSC Seymour/Gamble.** Accepted 4-0-1.
6. **PUBLIC COMMENT:** Aidan A. Cervantes introduced himself and stated his interest in learning about the Commission.
7. **CONDUCT BUSINESS:**
 - a. Conduct election of 2025 Commission Officers – **Superintendent Wallace** presented the staff report.
Commissioner Hanhan nominated herself for Chair. **MSB Seymour/Monaghan.** Unanimous.
Commissioner Gamble nominated **Commissioner Seymour** for Vice Chair. **MSB Gamble/Hanhan.** Unanimous.
 - b. Consider Change to Process for Selection of Films for Movies in the Park. **Superintendent Wallace** presented the staff report. **Commissioners** proposed to reapproach film screening dates, marketing strategy, and snacks provision. **Director Karlen** stated that Staff would work on a proposal and present at a later meeting. **MSB Seymour/Abumuoilish.** Accepted 5-0.
 - c. Accept a Presentation regarding the Mural Program and provide feedback. **Superintendent Wallace** presented the staff report. **Commissioners** provided feedback:
Section III - Narrow Murals definition.
Section IV - Include murals' locations could also be proposed by Culture and Arts Commission. Clarify the scope of granting the City rights to the artwork.
Section VI – Include San Bruno artists are encouraged as part of artists qualifications criteria. Include that artwork should be tied to/promote San Bruno culture and heritage as part of concept or art criteria. Request guidance from City Attorney on how to include San Bruno culture and heritage promotion in private property owner initiated murals.
Section VII - Include Commission could recommend allocation of funds from the City Art Fund to fund the maintenance plans. Primary use of City Art Fund should be for City initiated murals. Eliminate “first come, first serve”, and have funding available on a point basis, prioritizing San Bruno artists and how the art itself is tied to San Bruno culture and heritage.
Section X – Include in terms of easement agreements: process to change the mural, maintenance plan responsibility and funding, and decommissioning/removal plan responsibility and funding.

- d. Report Out from Commissioners on Progress on the Culture and Arts Commission Workplan (Oral). **Superintendent Wallace** conducted. 5) Art on Loan Program for Recreation and Aquatic Center – Ad-Hoc Committee: **Commissioners George, Hanhan, and Monaghan**. Progress: made a site visit at the Recreation and Aquatic Center and worked with San Mateo County Office of Arts and Culture. No progress to be reported on any other item. **Commissioners** agreed to reapproach Commission’s Workplan at a later meeting.

8. ITEMS FROM COMMISSION MEMBERS:

Commissioner Hanhan proposed to include in Commission’s Workplan an art walk on San Mateo Avenue.

Commissioner Seymour proposed to emulate “Hearts in San Francisco” public art project by the San Francisco General Hospital Foundation, launching a call for local artists to create a heart sculpture inspired in San Bruno’s brand “The City with a Heart”. He invited anyone interested in volunteering on May 23rd and 24th accepting/hanging artwork at the 2025 San Mateo County Fair to contact him. Tickets and lunch will be provided. He also mentioned that there will be a stage at the County Fair with acts every day. Those acts could also be seen at One Love Café on June 5th. He also invited everyone to the comedy/singers show at One Love Café on April 26th.

9. ITEMS FROM STAFF:

- a. Invitation to Shakespeare in the Park event - **Superintendent Wallace** invited everyone to Shakespeare in the Park Event on May 4th from 2:00pm to 3:00pm at the San Bruno City Park Pavilion.

SUBJECT: Review Submissions and Select Artists for Community Art Gallery Program 2025-2026

BACKGROUND:

The Culture and Arts Commission produces a call for artists each year for the Community Art Gallery program. The Commission then selects three artists to exhibit their works at the Library for four months each, in succession.

DISCUSSION:

A Call for Artists was developed and distributed in late February with a deadline date of April 10. The Commission received 19 submissions for consideration. Each artist submitted at least five, but not more than 15 digital images of the works they proposed to exhibit. These images have been transferred to a PowerPoint slideshow which will be shown to the Commission at its May meeting. Each Commissioner is requested to assign scores to each artist's overall submission. Each Commissioner will be provided with a scoresheet.

Commissioners are requested to score submissions based on technical expertise, creativeness, and appropriateness of the images. To recognize their contributions to the local community, San Bruno artists will receive 20 additional points out of 100, and San Mateo County artists will receive 10 additional points. Each Commissioner will return their scoresheet to Staff at the conclusion of the meeting. Staff will tally the votes and notify each artist of the results.

Artists will be notified of the results by May 30. The three selected artists will begin exhibiting their works at the San Bruno Library beginning July 1.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Each selected artist will be awarded a \$250 stipend paid from the City Art Fund.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that Commissioners record scores for each artist based on technical expertise, creativeness, and appropriateness of the images.

SUBJECT: Selection of Movies-in-the-Park for Public Voting

BACKGROUND:

Each year the Culture and Arts Commission hosts Movies-in-the-Park on Fridays during the month of September. At its April 24, 2025 meeting, the Commission adopted a change in the process of selection of films for Movies-in-the-Park, discontinuing genre-based voting for categories and instead allowing the public to select their four favorite films from a list of 15 options. Before this system was introduced, the Commission selected five movies in three different categories in which the public were allowed to vote.

Since there are four Fridays in September 2025, the four films receiving the highest number of votes – regardless of genre – would be selected for screening.

DISCUSSION:

Staff have developed a single list of thirty movies from different genres. The Commission will select fifteen movies from the list for the public to vote. Public voting will begin on June 9 and end on July 13.

FISCAL IMPACT:

RECOMMENDATION:

The Commission will select fifteen movies from the provided list for the public to vote.
